## Obj 1. Lawai‘a Pono

Responsible and respectful fishing practices and cultural resource use are consistently practiced within the CBSFA

## Obj 2. Perpetuate Traditional & Customary Fishing Practices

The Miloli‘i CBSFA is an environment that hosts training of traditional & customary fishing practices to the new generation of practitioners, residents, and visitors

## Obj 3. Conduct Education & Outreach

Increase support for the CBSFA is high as a result of raising awareness of outcomes and benefits that the CBSFA creates for people and ecosystems, and sustainable fisheries

## Obj 4. Implement Monitoring

Integrated contemporary & traditional Hawaiian (konohiki) monitoring provides an ongoing understanding of the abundance & condition of priority marine resources.

## Obj 5. Creation of Rules

Community-based subsistence fishing regulations are developed and adopted with a focus on perpetuating traditional & customary practice, increasing abundance of fish stock, improving ecosystem condition, and encouraging sustainable harvesting

## Obj 6. Voluntary Compliance

Increase compliance with the CBSFA regulations and decrease violations as a result of targeted outreach and enforcement action when needed

## Obj 7. Address Land Based Sources of Pollution

Understand and develop programs to address land-based sources of pollution that are impacting the nearshore marine environment in Miloli‘i
